Truth is Revealed when Encountering Jesus

...you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free."

John 8:32 ESV

As Jesus went, the people pressed around him. And there was a woman who had had a discharge of blood for twelve years, and though she had spent all her living on physicians, she could not be healed by anyone. She came up behind him and touched the fringe of his garment, and immediately her discharge of blood ceased.

And Jesus said, "Who was it that touched me?" When all denied it, Peter said, "Master, the crowds surround you and are pressing in on you!" But Jesus said, "Someone touched me, for I perceive that power has gone out from me."

And when the woman saw that she was not hidden, she came trembling, and falling down before him declared in the presence of all the people why she had touched him, and how she had been immediately healed. And he said to her, "Daughter, your faith has made you well; go in peace."

1. Reputation: Destitute & Desperate

...suffered much under many physicians...

2. Response: Bold & Inappropriate

She came up behind him and touched the fringe of his garment, and immediately her discharge of blood ceased.

Luke 8:44 ESV

The Lord said to Moses, "Speak to the people of Israel, and tell them to make tassels on the corners of their garments throughout their generations, and to put a cord of blue on the tassel of each corner. And it shall be a tassel for you to look at and remember all the commandments of the Lord, to do them...

Numbers 15:37-39 ESV

In ancient Mesopotamia, the hem of the garment made an important social statement. Documents from the city of Mari on the Euphrates (ca. 18th century BC) reveal that the hem of the garment represented the person who owned it and to cut off the hem implied an injury or denial of the person's value.

And the more important the individual, the more elaborate and the more ornate was the embroidery on the hem of his or her outer robe. The tassel must be understood as an extension of such a hem. When the hem is cut off, a part of the person's personality is removed.

Sozo: "has made you well." to heal, but also to save or deliver, Conceived of rescuing or delivering person from imprisonment or other afflictions.
